Assessment of Progress

English – Assessment will be achieved through 3 end of cycle assessments; November, March and June. Reading ages will also be assessed at these points using the Salford Reading test. Initial assessment included the McGrawhill Placement tests, Initial reading test based on KS2 questions, internal reading test and an initial assessment based on a 3 week transition SoL.

Maths – Assessment will be achieved through 3 end of cycle assessments; November, March and June along with a baseline test in September.

All students on the catch-up programme in year 7 continue to receive additional English and/or Maths support throughout year 8.

2017/18 Strategy Further detail

Year 7 English

Year 7 set 6 double staffed; 5 hours of curriculum time. The split between teachers is 3 (RB):2(AJW), supported by CF. Two of the lessons are used for the catch-up programme with a focus on reading. The teacher will do a core input which will include strategies such as teaching of vocab and sound patterns for word recognition, read a class text together and then be given differentiated reading tasks. Skills to be developed; recall, ordering of events, retrieval, prediction, summarising and inference. Grammar Hammer and Lexia as with the rest of the year groups will be another strategy used. This all ties in with the reading programme led by the Individual Needs department

Students in year 7 and 8 get 5 hours of English and 5 hours of Maths a week. The catch-up students are in the set 6 classes within English and Maths. These groups are double staffed by English and Maths teacher in both year 7 and year 8. Students are either supported within the classroom or are taught in small groups or 1 to 1. Going into 2017/18 the year 9 students will continue to be supported in this way.

In year 9, 10 and 11 some students will study 8.5 rather than 9.5 GCSE in order to continue the support with English and Maths.
