MUSIC & DRAMA

Following direction (5 MARKS)

Responded completely to the direction given during the music/drama aptitude tests

Partially responded to the direction given during the music/drama aptitude tests

X Did not respond well to the direction given during the music/drama aptitude tests

Focus, concentration and listening skills (5 MARKS)

Excellent focus, concentration & listening skills shown

✓ Some focus, concentration & listening skills shown

X Very little evidence of focus, concentration & listening skills shown

DRAMA

Creativity to the given brief (5 MARKS)

Excellent aptitude and imagination shown. Met all the guidelines.

✓ Some aptitude and imagination shown. Met some of the guidelines.

X No aptitude or imagination shown. No evidence of trying to meet the guidelines.

Characterisation; facial & vocal expression, movement, gesture and body language (5 MARKS)

An excellent range of facial, vocal, and physical expressions used to show the character's emotions, showing flair and aptitude for drama

✓ A good range of some aspects of characterisation used to try and show the characters emotions, showing some aptitude for drama

An attempt to show some basic characterisation but the inability to show this consistently across vocal, facial and physical interpretation

NB – in order to balance the points fairly across music and drama those who get 2 stars for Drama activities will be awarded 2 extra points to enable them to get the same maximum points as a talented musician.

Improvised rhythms (5 MARKS)

In time, shows flair and aptitude for pulse and rhythm.
