Cycle 1 mock exam revision preparation: English

How to use this timetable:

- Make sure you have revision materials organised and ready: revision packs for your choice of literature texts from:
 - An Inspector Calls, Macbeth, Power and Conflict Poetry and A Christmas Carol
- Make sure you have revision materials organised for both Language papers:
 - Language paper 1
 - Language paper 2
- Make sure you have the revision organiser sheets or revision booklet
- Follow the guidance on the timetable so that you evenly spread out your revision

The following strategies work well for revising English:

Character brain dumps

Brain dump and mind-map everything you can remember about a character. Include the following:

- High level tier 2 vocabulary from your English booklet
- Key moments in the text
- Key quotations (check booklet, text, exercise book and this pack)
- Links to themes
- Connections: to other characters and moments

Theme brain dumps

Brain dump and mind-map everything you can remember about the themes in the text (see pack / knowledge organiser). Include the following:

- Key moments in the play when this theme is portrayed
- Key quotations involving this theme

- How Priestley uses methods to portray this theme

Quotation explosions

Use flashcards or paper to group and then annotate key quotations linked to question or theme. Include the following:

- What is happening? Who is speaking? What is being described?
- What methods has the writer used?
- What does the quote mean and suggest?
- Analyse and unpick the effects of key words
- What intentions might the writer have through this quotation?

Essay practice

The most effective revision technique:

- Use the planning page inside this booklet to write an essay in response to the questions at the back. Ask your teacher to check your response and give you feedback.
