

Homework Timetable 2022-2023 Year 11



Home learning gives students the opportunity to consolidate and extend what they have learned in the Academy.

It helps students to:

- ▶ plan their time and develop confidence in learning.
- ▶ develop independent learning skills, to use now and in their future life.
- ▶ improve retention and recall of key facts in preparation for examinations.

The following is a guide of what homework will be given out when.

Aim to complete homework during the evening of the day it is set so that if you have any difficulties you have time to ask for help.

If no homework has been set spend 40 mins revising knowledge and skills using the subject 100% sheets. Use your 100% books to do this.

Subject	Length	Homework set:
English	1 hour 30mins	100% booklet, enrichment booklet. Exam tasks and revision activities. Daily reading.
Maths	1 hour	Tasks set on Sparx.
Science	1 hour	As set by the teacher.
Art	1 hour	Homework set linked to project work, including, reasearch, analysis and practical skill development.
DT	1 hour	Home learning book/learning from 100% books or project work book (NEA).
Drama	1 hour 30 mins	Written work and / or rehearsal.
Geography	1 hour	Knowledge questions based on 100% sheet. Mindmap task (Interleaving). Low stakes testing when due in.
Health & Social Care	1 hour	Controlled Assessment.
History	1 hour	Knowledge questions based on 100% booklet. Mindmap task (Interleaving). Low stakes testing when due in.
IT	1 hour	Revision activities for examined unit. Skills development and coursework for coursework unit.
Computer Science	1 hour	Knowledge questions based on 100% booklet Mindmap task (Interleaving). Low stakes testing when due in.
Music	1 hour	Set works, 100% booklet. Learning key words and musical elements. Instrument practice 4/5 times a week 30mins.
RE	30 mins	Learn from 100% booklet. MAP tasks.
Spanish	2 x 30mins	Vocab learning from 100% sheet - 15 words a week. Vocab test each week.
Sport	1 hour	Controlled assessment.

In addition to the above weekly homework students should be getting into the habit of daily revision using the 100% books, exercise books, revision guides and online resources. Revising little and often will mean that revision becomes a habit and less stressful than trying to cram nearer to the exams. Internal mock exams are in November and February. The public examination period starts in the middle of May.
